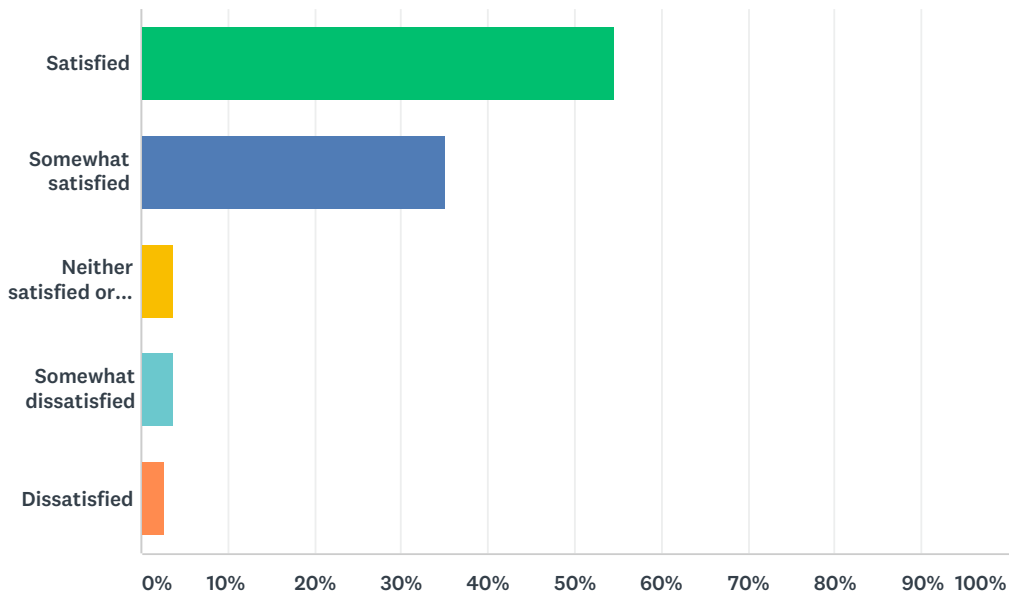


Q1 Overall, how satisfied are you with your membership in our Rotary club?

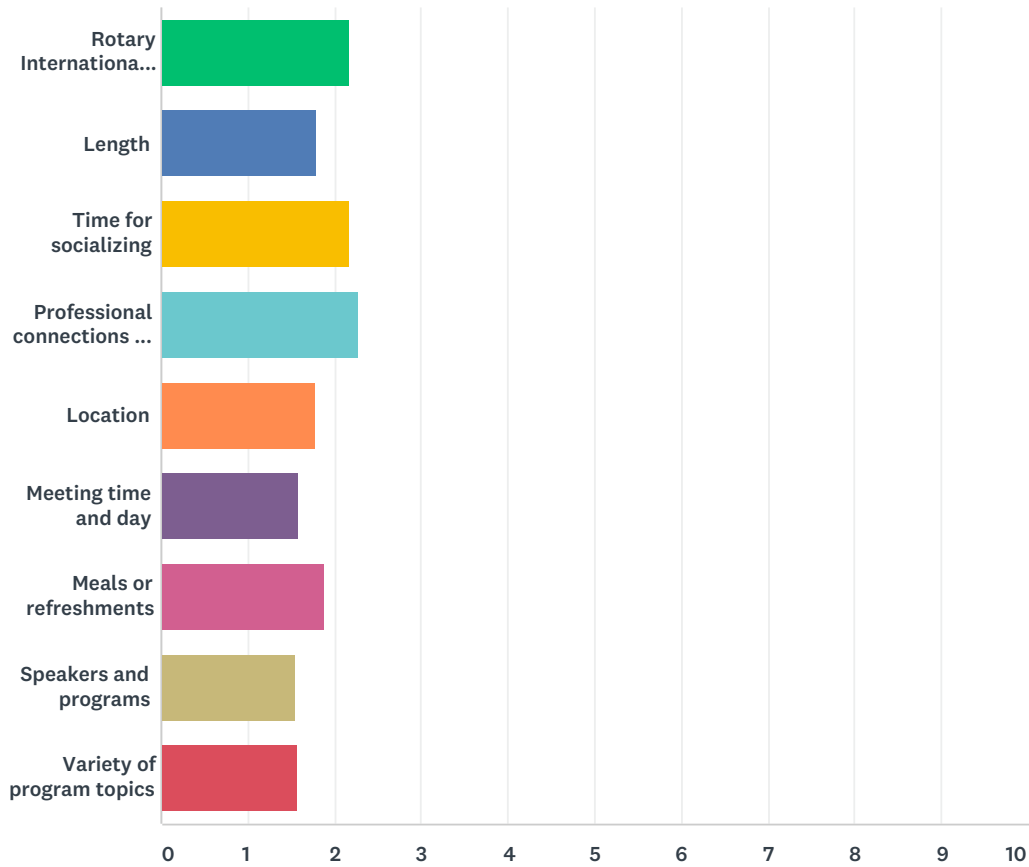

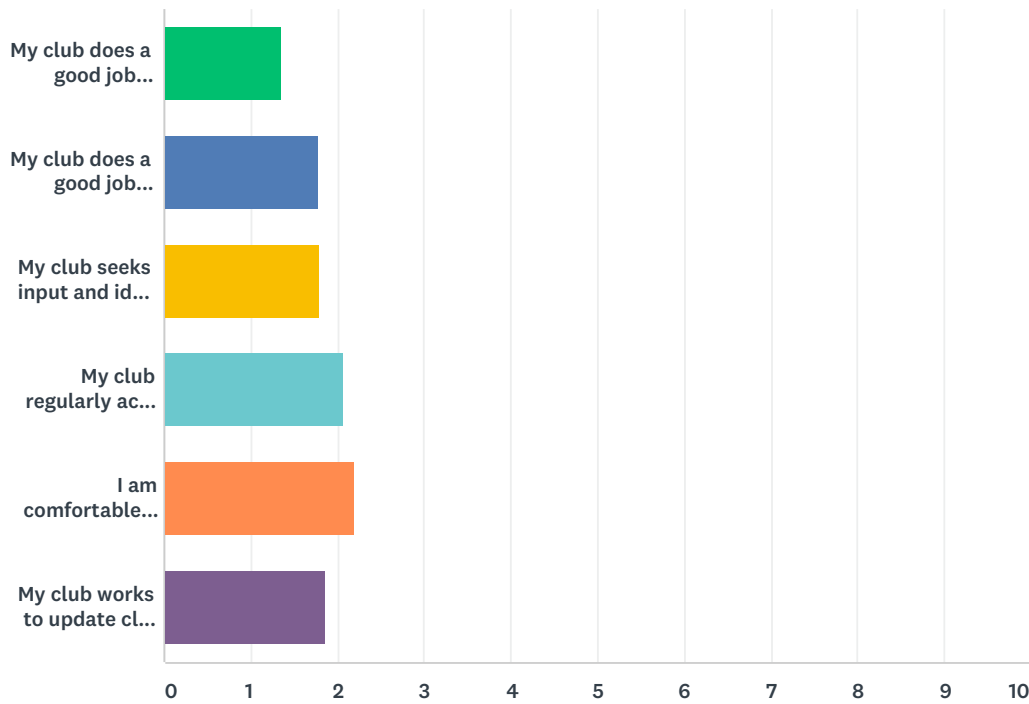

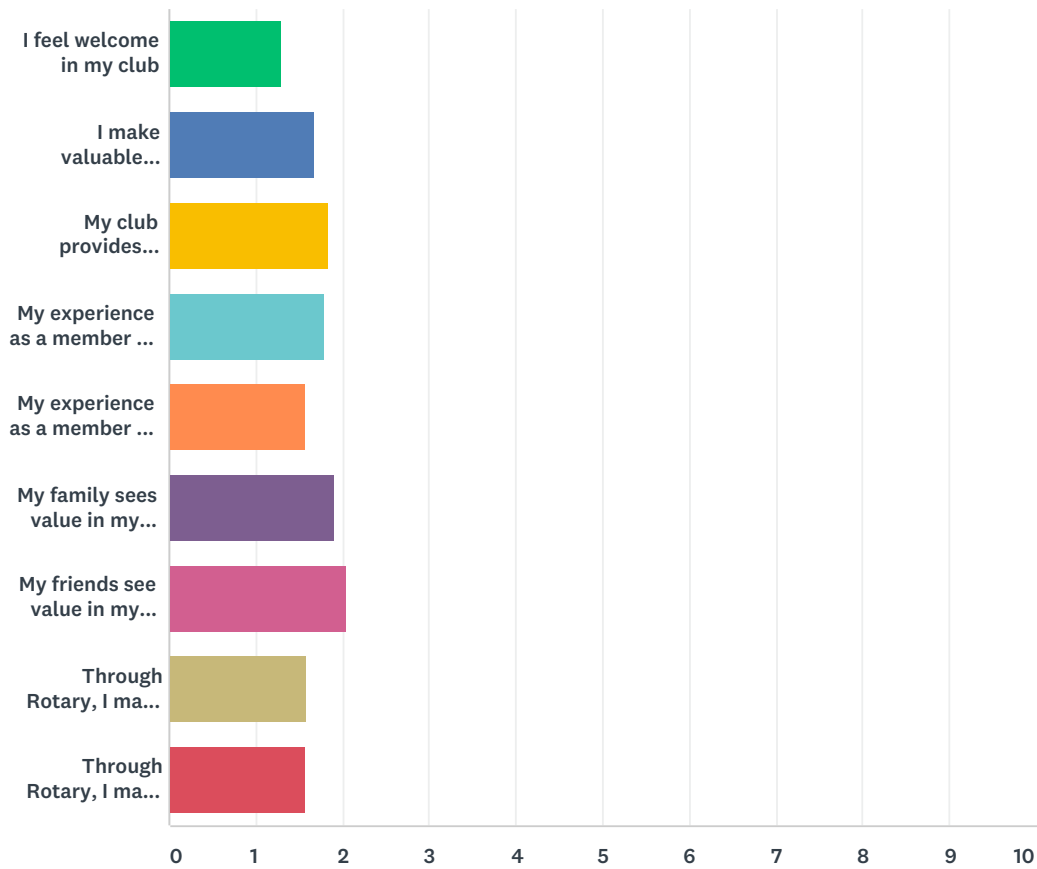

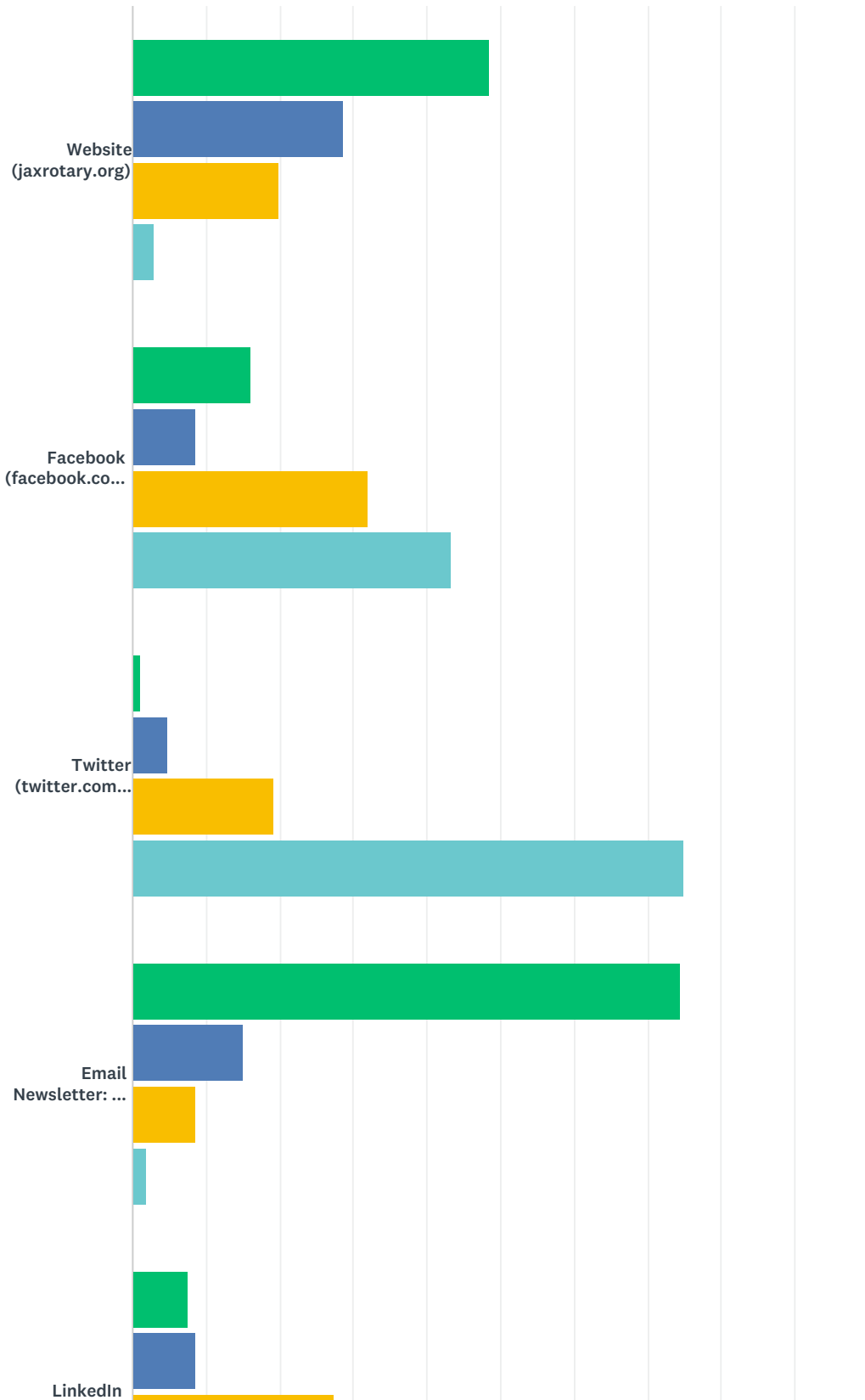
